
But we believe there is more ahead.




Expansion Project

NOW IS THE TIME!


For many years, South Central Ohio Nazarenes have valued our Nazarene campground. Our heritage is ingrained with meaningful experiences from camp meetings, summer camps, retreats and more. In 1990 God providentially led SCO to relocate from an urban area of Columbus to a stunning piece of property in Hocking Hills. This move provided us with an opportunity to create a sacred place for new generations to have meaningful encounters with God. Until now we have only realized a small part of the vision that our predecessors dreamed of, but now is the time to see the dream become a reality.

LODGE-STYLE DINING FACILITY: \$4.3M

The next phase that we believe God is asking us to pursue includes a state-of-the-art lodge-style dining facility. This facility will enhance the opportunities and desirability for the camp to be host events for various groups, creating an all-inclusive camping and event experience. This facility can set HHRC apart from other camps in the area, making it a sought-after destination for many events and experiences.

THE LAKE: \$.5M

Our Lake will provide a multitude of opportunities and experiences for campers. It will feature a beach for swimming, fishing, water recreation, sports and outdoor education, The tranquility of a sunrise or sunset over the water will be a great place to encounter God in His creation and afford opportunities to reflect on His Word and hear His voice. The lake will be centrally located near the stream and easily viewed from the dining facility.

ADVENTURE COURSE: \$.2M

Our Adventure Course will offer a unique blend of physical challenge, personal growth, and team-building opportunities for groups and individuals. Adventure courses foster trust, communication, and resilience, and provide opportunities to confront our limitations and grow in ways we never thought possible. It will be constructed above and near the lake and will include a zip line that connects to the lake.



4 MORE CABINS & SHOWER HOUSE: \$.25M

In April 2025 we completed 4 lodgestyle cabins and a shower house adding accommodations for about 80 more campers. We also began construction on 4 more cabins and another shower house to double the number of campers. These cabins provide a rustic, yet comfortable camping experience.



WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

Young people are leaving the church in masses. God has given us a unique resource to combat this exodus. With the magnificent backdrop of His creation, quality camp facilities, and intentional programming, we will provide a sacred place for the next generation to encounter the living God, mature their faith, and hear God's call for them to change the world and build His Kingdom.

MORE TO COME:

We believe that to complete our vision of a worldclass camp, there is much more to come. Our master plan includes 4 stunning lodges which each include a meeting space and kitchen to accommodate another 200 campers. More activities like horseback trail rides, paintball, go-kart track, tubing hill, archery, and a shooting range. Add to these miles of trails to explore, an amphitheater, and outdoor chapels and we are getting close to the vision God has entrusted to us.





According to a survey cited by the International Bible Society, 83% of Christians make their first commitment to Jesus between the ages of 4 and 14, during childhood or early adolescence.

Barna Research Group - Children (Ages 5-13)

Research by the Barna Group shows that American children between the ages of 5 and 13 have a 32% likelihood of accepting Christ.

Barna Research Group - Youth and Adults (Ages 14 and Older)

The same research indicates that the probability of becoming a Christian drops to 14% for youth aged 14 to 18, and falls further to just 6% for adults aged 19 and older.


Estate Plans

Bequest Gifts

You can start a legacy gift by creating an endowment that will continue to support the work of HHRC in perpetuity. You can leave a lasting legacy of spiritual impact by creating an endowment with a current gift or through your estate plan. In particular, you can give children & teens the gift of a future by helping provide a place where lifelong spiritual decisions are made.

One benefit of a Charitable Remainder Trust or Charitable Gift Annuity is receiving income from the gift. Usually, the income received is substantially greater than the income being received before the gift. In the case of the Charitable Gift Annuity, the income is guaranteed for life and based on your age.

One of the simplest ways to give is a bequest provision in your estate plan documents. Your bequests can be for a specific dollar amount, a percentage of your estate (a 10% tithe, for example) or the remainder of your estate after you have provided for others.





The sale of stocks, bonds, mutual funds, real estate, or business interests that have appreciated in value generate hefty capital gains taxes. Your gift of these holdings would avoid these taxes, and you would receive a charitable income tax deduction equal to the fair market value. Appreciated property gifts can be made directly or as a deferred gift, such as a Charitable Remainder Trust or Life Estate Agreement.

The fastest growing from of charitable giving is the Donor-Advised Fund (DAF). With a DAF, you make the initial gift of property or cash and receive a tax deduction for the full value of your gift. Your gift is then held and invested until you recommend distribution at a future time.

QCDs let you give directly from your IRA without increasing taxable income. QCDs can support HHRC fund endowments, provide immediate gifts, or go to a Charitable Gift Annuity. For those 73 and up, QCDs can count toward your Required Minimum Distribution—an especially useful option if you no longer itemize.

We envision camp meeting services where God moves and stirs revival in our local churches. We envision weekend retreats for men's groups, women's groups, children and teen groups. We see marriage conferences, concerts, weddings, family reunions and community events filling the calendar.

We envision this camp to be used by the Church, community groups, schools, universities, sports organizations and businesses. We believe that the Hocking Hills Retreat Center will be a witness to the creative power of God and the redemptive work He can do in the lives of everyone who walks the hallowed hills of our camp.

It seems the Lord is saying that now is the time. We have an opportunity to do something for the next generation that we've never had before. Someone once said, "The most important business of one generation is the raising of the next. Nothing else you do will be as deeply satisfying."

Research:

The National Study on Youth and Religion was a study of 3,370 teenagers, with three surveys over 6 years. They found that 80% of teens who were religious and attended religious camp were still religious 6 years later. Only 56% of those who were religious and did not participate in camp were still religious 6 years later. Attending a religious summer camp increased the likelihood of remaining religious by 24%.

The Effective Camp Project was a study of over 1000 campers from six different camps. They found some benefits of a Christian camp experience . . . including increased participatory learning and cognitive faith knowledge (aka Bible Facts). They also found long-term benefits of increased self-confidence, increased church attendance and increased devotional practices. The project summarized their results like this. "Young people are participating more deeply in their faith months after camp is over . . . they have gained . . . a desire to be in Christian community, a hunger to learn more, and the assurance that faith makes a difference in their lives."
